
Preliminary Ecosystem Services Framework: Project Checklist



“Ecosystem services” represent the human benefits that healthy ecosystems provide, including water purification, flood protection, and recreational opportunities. To better understand these services, officials and resource managers need a framework that integrates four key elements: *biophysical science*, *human benefits*, *stakeholder engagement*, and *communication*.

Use this questionnaire to explore these four elements and how integrated they are in your ecosystem services project. The questions are designed to assess whether the ecosystem services framework is right for you, as well as help you prepare for the planning process. While this quick reference approach is no substitute for a comprehensive guide, the process does provide a preliminary assessment to steer projects toward the right path.

A comprehensive ecosystem services project integrates the four components, but any combination can be incorporated into projects. For some questions, the answers may be uncovered as the project progresses. If your response to any of the questions is “no” or “unsure,” you may need additional reflection or planning.
