Accessing Ocean Economy Data for the Territories

The Economics: National Ocean Watch (ENOW) dataset recently added data on the ocean economy for all five U.S. territories. Information on employment, establishments, wages paid, and gross domestic product is provided in a variety of formats to fit your needs. Readymade visuals are perfect for presentations, and downloadable spreadsheets let you crunch the numbers for your own analysis.

Assessing Tidal Marshes to Rank Resilience

A healthy marsh is more resilient to change and offers greater protection for coastal communities. A recent National Estuarine Research Reserve System study sheds light on marsh health across the country. Using GIS-based metrics, the researchers ranked marsh resilience on a scale from one to ten. Based on the results, the study recommends management options and identifies undeveloped land in each region that could support healthy tidal marshes. New Hampshire's Great Bay National Estuarine Research Reserve is incorporating this information in their marsh management strategy.

Increasing Flood Risk Awareness Through a Real Estate Professional Training Program

In Pinellas County, Florida, a flood administrator expanded her program's reach by training local real estate professionals on flood risks, flood maps, and flood insurance. The training's popularity reflects the fact that real estate agents—and their clients—want to be more knowledgeable about flood insurance. Now, agents are educating potential buyers about flood risks while contributing to the county's Community Rating System credits.
