Summary of 2005-2010 CGSC Task Orders

- Total \$ awarded: \$22.6M of \$40M ceiling (57%)
- Primes: \$9.6M (43%); Subs: \$12.9M (57%)
- Imagery (19%); Elevation – topo/bathy (39%); Landcover Mapping (15%); GIS Services and Tool Development (9%); Benthic/Habitat Mapping (9%); Coral Reef (3%); Misc (6%)
